Praying THE JESUS PRAYER

The Jesus prayer comes to us from the desert Fathers. The rope is traditionally made by Orthodox nuns, using black wool and traditional knots and prayers. The colour black signifies the penitential nature of the prayer as black is associated with grieving. The tassel is uses (either symbolically or physically) to wipe away penitential tears.

A 5 decade rosary can be used, going around the rosary two or three times. Penitential prayer is not about guilt, it is all about awareness. Awareness of our personal and communal poverty of love, alongside an awareness of the immensity of Love given to us by our saviour. Our part in praying is simply to make ourselves available to Gods' love.

The rope has either 100 or 150 knots or beads arranged in decades. A short prayer is said on each knot/bead of the decade followed by a short prayer between decades.

The Jesus prayer has a mantra like repetition. The lips and the mind are occupied in prayer while the heart is given, with increasing intensity to the love and mercy of Christ. The spiritual senses gradually supplant the physical senses as the soul surges forward to meet it's saviour in love and gratitude.

THE PRAYERS

The following prayer is said on each knot/bead

"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, have mercy on me a sinner."

at the end of each decade

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, both now and ever and unto the ages of ages. Amen

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia, glory to you O God (three times)

Lord have mercy.

(three times)
